SMARTPHONE DATA USAGE -- The intensity of smartphone Wi-Fi data usage can vary by age group. This is according to information in a recent Nielson Insights report that examined Android user data patterns for the month of August 2016. At 14,115 uploaded/downloaded megabytes (MBs), 18-24 year olds led all age groups - a total nearly triple that of those over 65 (4,826). In second place were 25-34 year olds (11,176 MBs) followed by those 35-44 (9,290 MBs). The data also showed that all age groups favored Wi-Fi usage over cellular data plan usage by a ratio of at least 3:1. To access the report, go to http://tinyurl.com/zo4p7qf.

BULLISH ON INDUSTRIAL REAL ESTATE -- In a recent forecast survey by Southeast Real Estate Business, respondents named industrial real estate as one the top investment products in 2017. Survey participants anticipate a high volume of industrial sales this year because the product type is positioned to benefit from online shopping, supply chain efficiencies and development-friendly metros in the region. The survey also made note of favorable market conditions and pointed to evidence of high demand, rent growth and strong development activity.

MOVING IN AMERICA DECREASES -- The percentage of Americans moving over a one-year period fell to an all-time low of 11.2 percent in 2016, according to tables released last November by the Census Bureau. Among those who moved, 42.2 percent said they moved for a housing-related reason, such as wanting a new or better home or apartment. Others said their reasons were family-related (27.4 percent) or employment-related (20.2 percent). Regionally, the South saw the greatest number of people moving out (901,000), but also had the largest inflow (940,000).

VALENTINE'S DAY BY THE NUMBERS -- The 2015 estimated values of U.S. chocolate and non-chocolate confectionery product shipments by manufacturing establishments were \$16 billion and \$10.1 billion, respectively.
