SBIR/STTR PHASE I AND COST PROPOSAL WORKSHOP – The UCF Business Incubation Program will offer an SBIR/STTR Phase I and Cost Proposal Workshop: Learn How To Prepare a Winning Proposal for Your Business from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 10. The workshop will be presented by Jim Greenwood of the Greenwood Consulting Group at the UCF Business Incubator - Central Florida Research Park, 3259 Progress Drive, Orlando. Attendance will include a free proposal review from Greenwood, who has been a reviewer for federal agencies many times. This saves you the \$450 for Phase I Proposal review. Small businesses engaged in research and development (R&D) may be eligible to access these government dollars through the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) and the Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) programs. Known as "America's Seed Fund," the SBIR/STTR programs provide access to R&D funds to stimulate technological innovation. The program can help individuals and small businesses by providing access to grant funds to support proof of concept and prototype development. The fee is \$95 if you register by Sept. 20, or \$120 after Sept. 20. The registration fees will include materials covered, breakfast, lunch and the workshop. FLORIDA DEO LAUNCHES REBUILD FLORIDA PROGRAM – The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity's (DEO) has launched Rebuild Florida, a long-term recovery effort that will provide \$616 million to help Florida families repair or rebuild their homes that were significantly damaged or destroyed by Hurricane Irma. Rebuild Florida is a program partnership with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. It will connect eligible Floridians with federal disaster recovery funding, prioritizing most-impacted communities and the most vulnerable low-income individuals. Registration is available at www.RebuildFlorida.gov or by calling the Rebuild Florida representatives at 844-833-1010. Eligible Florida residents have until Dec. 23 to register for the Rebuild Florida Housing Repair and Replacement Program. The program is open to residents who own their homes and also to owners of rental properties. Detailed eligibility requirements are available at www.RebuildFlorida.gov.
