LATEST BEIGE BOOK REPORT ON ATLANTA FED DISTRICT IS MIXED – According to the September Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta's southeast regional summary of economic activity, overall conditions moderated slightly and labor market tightness persisted. Wage growth remained steady, input costs rose slightly, and retail sales and tourism activity were mixed. Real estate sales and construction were down from a year ago. Manufacturing activity softened, and banking conditions remained steady. The Beige Book is a Federal Reserve System, or "Fed," publication that characterizes regional economic conditions across the country's 12 Federal Reserve Districts. Florida is a part of the Atlanta Fed District's southeast region.
