U.S. PATENT OFFICE REPORTS WOMEN STILL A MINORITY OF PATENTED INVENTORS – Earlier this year, the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office released "Progress and Potential: A profile of women inventors on U.S. patents," a report on the trends and characteristics of U.S. women inventors named on U.S. patents granted from 1976 through 2016. The report shows that women still comprise a small minority of patented inventors and highlights an untapped potential of women to spur innovation in the United States. The report delivers several important findings. The share of patents that include at least one woman as an inventor increased from about 7% in the 1980s to 21% by 2016. Even with this increase in patent counts, women inventors made up only 12% of inventors on patents granted in 2016. Gains in female participation in science and engineering occupations and entrepreneurship are not leading to broad increases in female inventors earning a patent.
